

This is the time of year we begin feeling the urge to look at the boating catalogs and publications to see what's new. It's also time to possibly take in a boat show or two. The Central New York Boat Show will be held Thursday, 18 February, through Sunday, 21 February, at the New York State Fairgrounds. Syracuse Sail & Power Squadron will host and we have been invited to participate. D/Lt/C Jeff Freedman, AP, has again arranged to have the Boating Skills Virtual Trainer (BSVT) available for demonstrations. This is a boating simulator for marine craft. The BSVT is a USPS training unit that has three 20-inch monitors, a steering wheel with trim tab controls, a throttle, and a computer program that simulates on-the-water boating situations. Please contact me if you would like to help out at the booth and I will arrange free

admission to the show.

Bridgette Hobart Janeczko Accomplishments

Bridgette Hobart Janeczko, daughter of Dr. Richard and Margie Hobart, longtime members of the Susquenango Sail and Power Squadron, is the first documented person to swim the length of nine of the Finger Lakes. She was not allowed to swim Hemlock and Canadice Lakes as they are water sources for the city of Rochester.

This past summer she spent most of her weekends swimming the length of the lakes with a dedicated crew and her husband, Bob, Bridgette with her parents, Dr. Richard and kayaking beside her. She began her challenge on Canandaigua Margie Hobart, after her swim of Cayuga lake Lake on 11 July taking 7 hours and 38 minutes. The following week- on 8 August 2015 end she conquered Keuka Lake in 9 hours and 7 minutes. Skaneate- Photo by Mary Kucharek les Lake was completed on 26 July in 7 hours and 27 minutes.



Bridgette's parents, along with Susquenango members Bob and Mary Kucharek, were at Treman Marina boat launch on 8 August to welcome Bridgette as she finished her 38 mile swim of Cayuga Lake in 20 hours and 33 minutes. Seneca Lake is the same Length as Cayuga, but due to poor weather conditions it took 24 hours and 33 minutes for completion on 29 August. During the September 18 and 19 weekend she swam Honeoye Lake in 2 hours and 2 minutes and Canesus Lake in 3 hours and 46 minutes. She completed her swim of Owasco Lake on 26 September in 5 hours and 57 minutes after completing Otisco Lake the day before in 2 hours and 56 minutes.

In all, she swam for 129 hours to master the Finger Lakes swim. She also swam the English Channel in September 2014 and 120 miles of the Hudson River in June 2015. For her year-long performance as she balanced work, family and organization of her charity swims, Bridgette was given the World Open Water Swimming Woman of the Year Award. She also received the 2015 Distinguished Alumni Award from Nazareth College. Pretty amazing feat. We are proud of you, Bridgette.

Highlights of the Executive Meeting—16 December 2015

Commander David Olds, AP, called the meeting to order at 1907.

Secretary Lt/C Ann Smith, S, reported that a quorum was present. The minutes from the November General Membership Meeting were accepted as distributed.

P/D/Lt/C Jack Young, AP, distributed the treasurer's report which indicated a decrease in the account balance.

Education Officer Lt/C Les Smith, AP, reported that requests to use the Johnson City High School for two ABC classes were submitted at the beginning of December. The class schedule is on page three of this issue. As soon as the approval for use of the facilities is received, Les will notify Dave Olds and Lt/C Mary Kucharek to produce ads on the website and in the local newspapers.

Membership reported that the squadron currently has 65 members including 15 life members.

P/D/Lt/C Jack Young, AP, called on SeaChest business manager, Lt Vonda Oakley, who reported that Auto Finishers renewed their ad for the next year. Also, letters were sent to marinas to ask for donations and advertisements for the SeaChest. A response from Kelley Marine Center was received and they agreed to place an ad in the SeaChest.

Lt Linda Rought, P, announced that the next meeting will be a General Membership meeting on Wednesday, 20 January at Brothers 2. (pizza dinner at 6:00 PM and meeting at 7:00 PM)

D/Lt/C Nancy Bieber, P, announced that arrangements have been made to attend the Cider Mill Playhouse dress rehearsal presentation of "*The Fantasticks*", a musical with lyrics by Tom Jones, on Wednesday, 27 January at 7:00 PM. Contact Nancy Bieber for more information and tickets.

Old Business: The OD2 form must be completed by the nominating committee with the list of next year's Executive Committee Members and Elected Officers and Committees. Replacements are needed for the Secretary and Executive Officer. Dave Olds received a reminder from the chief commander regarding having a successor in place for the Executive Officer. The proposed nominations will be submitted to the SeaChest for the February issue.

New Business: There was a review and discussion of the squadron policies (which define items not covered by the squadron bylaws). A motion was made by Nancy Bieber, seconded by Linda Rought and carried to accept several updates that were presented.

There was a discussion on placing the Baker/Rought fund in a separate bank account. The item will be discussed further at the next meeting when more details are available. Also discussed was the development of a strategic plan for the Squadron including methods for attracting new members. This is an ongoing item that will be discussed further at the next meeting.

The Susquenango *Change of Watch* will be held on 19 March 2016 and will combine with the regular March General Membership Meeting. The appropriate USPS principles were notified of the change.

The meeting was adjourned at 2037.
