Power Cord Safety and Care

The use of any extension cord can be dangerous, but doubly so if not used properly around water.

Cords with marking of SEW, SJOW, SJOOW, SJTW, SOW, SOOW, STW AND STO are hard service cords and are for use with marine 30 AMP #10 AWG (American Wire Gauge) shore power cords.

Do not use any cord that is labeled for "indoor use only" as a shore power cord.

Do not over load any cord. Check the number of AMPS or WATTS that the cord is designed for and don't overload it. Overloading a cord causes heat and possible fire.

Check cords regularly to see if they are damaged; i.e. cracked, cut, pinched, etc..

- Turn off the load on the cord before unplugging or plugging in. This relieves the arcing on the metal contacts.
- Do not remove the grounding blade of a cord. If the receptacle does not have a ground, do not use any adapters that will eliminate the ground conductor.
- All outside electrical receptacles are to be GFCI protected. There are also portable GFCI receptacles available.
- Never coil a power cord between your thumb and elbow. This twists the conductors and overheats and breaks down the insulation of the wire which can cause a fire.
