Glen Curtiss Museum Tour

This is a museum of local history with a focus on Glenn Curtiss, a famous aviation pioneer who was gifted with an insatiable curiosity, mechanical ability, and ambition. In his teens he was obsessed with bicycles and speed, and was a champion racer who progressed to designing and building his own machines. Eventually he began manufacturing his own motorcycles and soon turned to developing airplanes.

The museum boasts a large collection of Curtiss' airplanes and many other items pertaining to the local Finger Lakes area such as boats and wine culture. It contains about a dozen aircraft developed by Curtiss including a flying reproduction of the AEA (Aerial Experimnt Association) June Bug, one of his early planes, as well as many of his original planes.

We will be visiting the Curtiss Museum in Hammondsport, NY on Saturday, 18 November 2017. Admission is \$12 for adult, \$10 for senior, and \$8 for student. After our tour we will go to the Timber Stone Grill in Hammondsport for a late lunch/early dinner. The restaurant has great reviews with a variety of dishes from which to choose.

We will meet at 10:00 AM at the Oakdale Mall parking lot by Sears and it will be about an hour and a half ride to the museum.
