Some Nautical Trivia

What does Above Board mean?

Pirates would often hide much of their crew below the deck. Ships that displayed crew openly on the deck were thought to be honest merchant ships. Thus they were as known as "above board."

What does As the Crow Flies mean?

The most direct route from one place to another is a straight line. Before modern navigational systems were developed, large sailing vessels usually carried a cage of crows. These birds are known to fly straight to the nearest land when released at sea, this indicated where the nearest land was.

What is the *Bitter End?*

The last part of a rope or final link of chain. It's the end attached to the vessel, as opposed to the "working end" which may be attached to an anchor, a cleat, or another vessel, etc. When not used nautically the term describes a final, painful, or disastrous conclusion.
