About the Cruise

This is a two-hour, narrated cruise, featuring views of Myers Point, the Cayuga palisades, famous homes and more. We'll share both the human and natural history of the Finger Lakes, and catch a glimpse of the fascinating ecology of Cayuga Lake. Adults and kids alike may join in optional lake science demonstrations and activities, or just sit back and relax.

Featuring Discover Cayuga's most experienced interpreters, who will provide a personalized tour and be available to chat with guests throughout.

Our course will typically take us 8-9 miles up the west shore, past cottage communities, historical and geological sites. We cross the lake to Myers Point, with a view of Taughannock Point, and cruise back along the east shore. Routes vary with conditions.

Our presentation: Our crew members are trained to act as "ambassadors to Cayuga Lake", and will provide a personalized narration focusing on both the human and natural history of the area. They will be available to chat individually, and provide "next step" suggestions for guests. Mid-day cruises also may present and opportunity for guests to interact with our interns, who are quite knowledgeable, and involved in lake study projects.

Amenities & Info

Our boat- MV Teal is spacious, capable of accommodating 90 passengers. Men's & women's bathrooms are available, with flush toilets and running water. Partial enclosure makes damp weather comfortable.

- Wheelchairs and assistive tech. accommodated. Bathrooms not yet handicapped accessible.
- Guests are welcome to bring snacks, beverages of their choice (and appropriate containers)
- Drinking water is available on board though we encourage you to bring your own. Please also bring your own reusable water bottle if possible.
- Children's and infant life jackets are available.
- A sub sandwich lunch will be available if reserved through Linda Rought (see page 3)

We have a canoe ride Friday morning, 30 August from 9:00 AM 'till 11:00 AM at the Minna Anthony Nature Center in Wellesley Island State Park. We will be in a 36 ft. canoe and will paddle through Eel Bay with a park naturalist.

Fun continues on Friday when we go to Brockville for the *Tall Ship Festival*. This rendezvous isn't all fun and games, you know, as some of us will be expected to work at the Festival. The shifts are 3½ hours long & that entitles you to free entry to the festival plus you'll get a T-shirt to prove it. One of the highlights is the *Parade of Sail* which occurs at 4:00 PM. There will be other booths, activities, & food vendors both Friday and Saturday. The "*Red Hot and Blue Rockabilly Weekend*" will be located right next to the Tall Ship Festival offering you the opportunity to visit the music festival on your own.

We will be Ambassadors for the Canadian Coast Guard frigate and will assist the Coast Guard members in any way we can while they are off board. On Saturday the public is allowed to tour the Ships and we will be assisting on the **Bluenose II**. That evening we will have a Prime Rib buffet at Edgewood Resort.

If you are planning on arriving by boat, there is very limited dockage space as the Tall Ships use most of it. There is public dockage at the Tall Ship Marina or you can try to reach the Brockville Yacht Club. Reservations need to be made ASAP as they fill up fast. Please make room reservations on your own. The Bridgeview Motel in Alexandria Bay is the closest to the Canadian Bridge. It's family owned, clean, & has reasonable rates. When crossing into Canada, you will need a passport or an enhanced drivers license. Reservations are due to Linda Rought by 14 August 2019. Reservation Form/s will be included in the *Deep Six special edition*.
