
BOSCOV'S FRIENDS HELPING FRIENDS





Star Party Constellations in the Clayton Night Sky



Important Dates in Nautical History by D/C Rick Hibbs, SN-IN

(Founder's Day Remarks 18 Feb 2017)

In July and August of 1588, the Spanish Armada held cruise and rendezvous to England, Calais, and Ireland.

Since this was about 400 years before the Cruise Planning & Weather courses were first offered by the United States Power Squadron, America's Boating Club, it is not surprising they lost 67of130 ships. And their membership was reduced by 20,000 sailors and passengers! To their credit, they did set out with 14,000 barrels of wine and 23,000 quartals of bacon (which is 2.3 million pounds!).

In 1714 the British Admiralty finally saw fit to offer a prize of 20,000 pounds to anyone that could find a method to reliably determine longitude at sea.

By 1737 John Harrison had demonstrated a ship's chronometer that could reliably keep time, enabling longitude to be determined at sea, significantly reducing the number of British shipwrecks. Truth be told, it did add another degree of difficulty to the future displays on GPS devices, but nothing's perfect!

On October 13, 1775, the US Navy was formed.

On August 4, 1790, the US Coast Guard was formed.

On October 21, 1805, the British team, with head coach Admiral Lord Nelson, defeated the French & Spanish All-Star Team at Trafalgar, thus winning naming rights for the Prime Meridian, which we know today as "Greenwich".

February 2, 1841, Ground Hog Day was first observed in the United States.

In 1845 the SS Great Britain, the first propeller driven steam ship, crossed the Atlantic, and the need for an Engine Maintenance Course was identified!

On March 8, 1862, the Monitor & Merrimack fought to a draw in the first battle of non-sailing ironclad ships, thus showing a continuing need for the Engine Maintenance Course. (Show of hands for all who've taken the course?)

On April 15, 1912, the bar steward regrets calling for "More ice!", as the Titanic sinks. To commemorate this tragedy, in 1955 April 15th became the official Income Tax Day.

On February 2, 1914, the United States Power Squadron was formed, 73 years after the first Ground Hog's Day. Tho' the founding was arguably more important; it's sadly much less well known among the general public. The USPS mission was to educate boaters in the skills necessary to leave port and safely return. FINALLY!!!

On May 2, 1938, 350 years after the Spanish Armada cruise disaster, the Rochester Power Squadron (now America's Boating Club of Rochester) was chartered.

On Sept 26 1964, the first episode of Gilligan's Island aired; arguably the second worst cruising disaster!

So, let's raise our glasses to toast the founding of the US Power Squadrons and, by extension, all the resulting districts and local squadrons now 16 days into our 103rd year of existence!
